## Group to host training sessions on suicide prevention

One of the groups for Leadership Medina County is focusing on mental health in the community and working to promote QPR training that is funded by Alternative Paths in partnership with the ADAMH Board.

QPR training focuses on recognizing warning signs, offering hope and saving the life of someone considering suicide. The steps of the training include questioning a person about suicide, persuading someone to get help and referring someone to the appropriate resource.

The group's goal is to raise awareness, support those suffering and promote an overall understanding of mental health. Throughout the next two months, the

group will be organizing training sessions for organizations throughout the county. To register for the training sessions, visit bit.ly/3hAkBcn.
