Largest class since inception in late 2021 given recognition

MEDINA — Medina Municipal Court's Valor Court on Tuesday honored its largest graduating class since the program's inception in late 2021.

"We are very pleased this afternoon to have five graduates graduating from our program," Medina Municipal Judge Gary Werner said. "All with their own contributions to the quality of this program."

Valor Court is dedicated to assisting those with military experience who are in the criminal justice system, helping those with physical and/or mental trauma.

The program provides an evidence-based alternative to traditional sentencing methods and is structured to assist veterans with access to programs, treatment and access to mentor peers.

Participants are required to follow all the

procedures associated with the program, such as like assisting in their treatment plan, showing improvement as time goes on and attending probation department meetings, treatment agency meetings and court sessions.

After the participant goes through the program, meeting the different requirements set by the court, they are then eligible for graduation.

On Tuesday, Medina Municipal Court's courtroom was filled with active participants in the program, the mentor peers involved and court staff to recognize the five graduates for their completion of the program.

In addition, Medina County commissioners Colleen Swedyk and Steve Hambley were there, as were Medina County Sheriff Terry Grice, Medina County ADAMH Board Director Phillip Titterington and Medina Mayor Dennis Hanwell.

"I've been here from day one with each of you and watched your transformation from the day you walked into this courtroom," Hanwell said. "Your appearance, your attitude and your outlook. We couldn't be more proud of you, proud of the work that the court and the court staff are doing and most of all, your success."
